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1 INTRODUCTION

This Consultation Statement has been prepared to fulfil the legal obligations of the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012. It has been prepared by the Sherfield English Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee on behalf of Sherfield English Parish Council, with support from Test Valley Borough Council (TVBC) and Bluestone Planning LLP, consultants to the Parish Council.

Section 15(2) of Part 5 of the Regulations sets out what a Consultation Statement should contain:

- (a) details of the persons and bodies who were consulted about the proposed Neighbourhood Plan;
- (b) an explanation of how the community was consulted;
- (c) a summary of the main issues and concerns raised by the persons consulted;
- (d) a description of how these issues and concerns have been considered and, where relevant, addressed in the proposed neighbourhood development plan.

2 AIMS OF THE CONSULTATION

The aims of the Sherfield English Neighbourhood Plan Consultations were:

- To involve as much of the community as possible throughout all consultation stages of The Plan development so that The Plan was informed by the views of local people and other stakeholders from the start of the Neighbourhood Planning process;
- To ensure that consultation events took place at critical points in the process where decisions needed to be taken;
- To engage with as wide a range of people as possible, using a variety of approaches and communication and consultation techniques; and
- To ensure that results of consultation were fed back to local people and available to read (in both hard copy and via the Neighbourhood Plan website pages) as soon as possible after the consultation events.

In preparing the Sherfield English Neighbourhood Plan, the Steering Committee have consulted residents, local businesses, TVBC, and other interested parties. Further details of consultations are itemised in Table 1.

3 BACKGROUND

3.1 Plan Area

The Sherfield English Neighbourhood Plan area encompasses the whole of Sherfield English Parish and the planning authority is Test Valley Borough Council (TVBC).

3.2 Initiation of neighbourhood planning

Extensive work on neighbourhood planning had already been carried out within the parish to produce the 'Parish Plan' in 2008 and the 'Village Design Statement' in 2015. A village web site, www.sherfieldenglish.org.uk was created early on, with Parish Council pages for the above and subsequent documents, survey forms and reports, etc.

To ensure that any future development took place in keeping with the needs of the community, and within the framework of the TVBC Local Plan, a Steering Committee made up of residents and Parish Councillors was set up, and development of a Neighbourhood Plan started in 2018.

4 CONSULTATIVE PROCESS

4.1 Summary

Throughout the creation of the Neighbourhood Plan, the Parish Council have updated residents of progress via articles in the monthly village newsletter, Parish Council NDP website pages, regular feedback to Parish Council Meetings and presentations at the Annual Parish Council Meetings.

Building on previous work for The Parish Plan and Village Design Statement, a number of Parish-wide surveys were conducted to maximise participation in the NP. All surveys conducted by the Steering Committee were made available on-line using Survey Monkey whilst providing paper forms for those not having access to the internet. The only exception was the Housing Needs Survey which was conducted by an external agency, AECOM.

The main Parish wide surveys involving the residents were:

- A village-wide survey, both online and as a supplement to the SEDCA newsletter, was the first formal task of the NDP. The results were presented at the Annual Parish Meeting on 8th May 2019. The report was published in the SEDCA newsletter at the end of June 2019. A Housing Needs Survey by the AECOM consultancy followed in 2020. Summaries are available on the village website.
- After support from a specialist planning consultant to draft a set of core policies a second more specific parish wide survey was undertaken in 2021.

Open days were held at St Leonards Church Community in November 2021, Village Hall Community Family Draw event in April 2023 and another Village Hall community NP Drop IN coffee morning is planned for 10th February 2024.

The statutory pre-submission consultation stage in accordance with Regulation 14 is taking place from 28th January 2024 to 10th March 2024. Again responses could be made either on-line, by email or by post. *A further consultation under Regulation 16 to be reported on in due course.*

4.2 Parish-wide consultations

4.2.1 Residents Survey 2019

The purpose of the 2019 survey was to build on previous parish surveys and understand residents' views on further housing development and how they would like to see the Parish evolve.

The survey was designed by the Sherfield English Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee and copies of a questionnaire were printed and hand delivered with our monthly newsletter to every residential property in the Parish, some 300 in total.

Completed forms were returned via Parish Councillors or nominated representatives at the Post Office, Church and Village Hall, although the vast majority were completed online using Survey Monkey. Over 80 detailed responses were received, representing an estimated 25% of households.

4.2.2 Housing Needs Assessment

A Housing needs survey was undertaken in 2021 by consultants AECOM to identify the housing needs of local people for the next five years or more.

The report is included in the Evidence Base.

4.2.3 Policy Consultation Autumn 2021

The Policy consultation was promoted via Facebook, Parish website, the free village newsletter, and posters on the parish notice boards.

The survey was online but hard copies of the survey were available at several collection points and could be returned to the Parish Office on completion. . Members of the NP team were available at the monthly church coffee morning in November 2021.

Overall there were 64 detailed responses from residents and business in the parish. All policies were supported by at least 75%, with most supported by over 90%. A copy of the report to the Parish Council in January 2022 is available on the web site, and is in the Evidence Base.

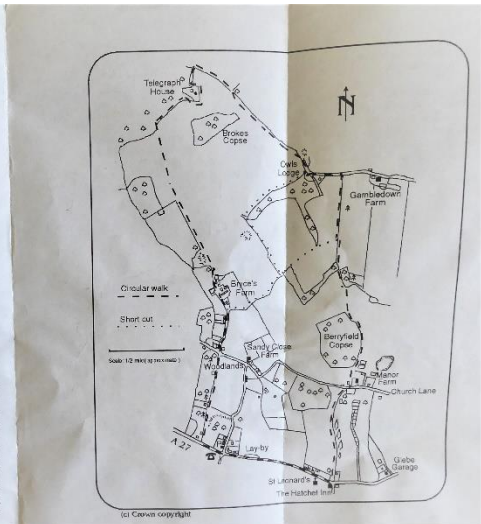
Introduction

The Sherfield English walk is about 4.5 miles long with the opportunity to take short cuts. The route is clearly marked with Public Footpath signs. The walk can start at any point and, of course, be walked in any direction, but it is advisable to wear good stout shoes. The Ordnance Survey sheets for this area are the Land ranger series 184 & 185. When you are using this walk please follow the country code.

The Walk

From the car park of **The Hatchet** (or the lay-by on the A27) take the footpath going north that links the A27 and **Church Lane**. Notice the watercress beds off to your right. These watercress beds were already in existence when the First Edition of the Ordnance Survey map was published in 1816. At that date much of the Sherfield area was still common land. You will see that Church Lane is at some distance from the modern church of St Leonard's, built in 1902/3. The old church has gone but its church yard is just off to the right. Cross the lane and follow the path with **Manor Farm** on the right and proceed up the hill going round **Berryfield Copse** on your left.

Among the less usual plants you may see on this part of the walk are: corn marigold, knot weed, woodruff, lesser hemp nettle and musk thistle. When you get to the top of the ridge turn round and look south and you will see a ridge that marks the northern edge of the New Forest.



Dormice in Sherfield English

Are extremely elusive and increasingly rare, but are found in Sherfield English.

The hazel dormouse, *Muscardinus avellanarius*, is unlike other rodents, being long-lived and highly specialised in its ability to hibernate. It has a bright golden colour, big black eyes and is the only rodent with a furry tail. Head-body length: 9–10cm, tail length: 5.5–8cm, lifespan up to 5 years.

Habitat Edges of deciduous woodland, thick, overgrown hedgerows and scrub and rarely cross open ground.

Diet Bramble provides pollen in the spring and berries in the autumn. Fruits, hazelnuts, beechmast and sweet chestnuts, as well as aphids and other small insects. Hazel, honeysuckle, bramble and oak are probably the most important food sources.

Habits nocturnal. Breeding males live alone, females and non-breeding males are often found nesting together. Sometimes the same male and female will live together in successive years.

Breeding 3–7 blind, naked young are born in July/August. Babies remain with mother in nest for up to 6 weeks & usually just one litter a year.

Dormice have become extinct across half their range in England due to continuing loss of ancient woodland, splitting of big woods into smaller ones and unsympathetic woodland management; if the woodlands in which they live become isolated and too small they cannot survive. They have very specific feeding requirements, do not live in large numbers at any one site and are not able to easily move to new sites. They are very sensitive to changes in their habitat and the climate.

Cutting hedgerows is recommended on a three-year cycle – one side, top, other side to allow time for shrubs to flower and fruit which provides optimum food sources.

4.2.6 Regulation 14, Pre-submission consultation

The Pre-submission consultation for the draft of the Sherfield English Neighbourhood Plan and associated documentation is being held from 28th January February to 10th March 2024. The consultation was online and promoted via Facebook, the Parish website and posters within the Parish. Paper copies and consultation forms were made available.

In addition to the statutory consultees (see Table 2 for list), owners of land having sites proposed as Local Green Spaces were contacted by email, where, known informing them of the consultation. Businesses known to operate within the Parish were also contacted about the consultation

Neighbourhood Plan Regulation 14 Consultation

The Sherfield English Parish Council and a team of residents, with the support of a specialised planning consultant, have been working on developing a Neighbourhood Plan to support residents to have a legal say over our locality. This has been a huge amount of work but the end is now in sight.

The Draft Neighbourhood Plan is now ready for the 'Regulation 14' public consultation, a statutory requirement. All residents and local businesses, within the Plan area, and a very long list of specified bodies have the opportunity to comment on the draft plan. All comments will be reviewed by the steering committee and the draft plan amended accordingly, prior to its final submission to TVBC for a 'Regulation 16' public consultation 'examination' and then (hopefully) a parish referendum.

4.3 Meeting the statutory requirement

In the preparation of the Sherfield English Neighbourhood Plan residents and business owners have been encouraged to comment and raises issues or concerns through responding to surveys or via the Parish Council.

All statutory requirements have been met and additional consultation, engagement, and research has been completed. This Consultation Statement has been produced to document the consultation and engagement process undertaken and is considered to comply with Part 5, Section 15 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012.

5 STRATEGIC ENVIRONMENT AND HABITAT REGULATION ASSESSEMENTS

As the NP area is within and neighbouring various designated areas it is necessary for the Local Planning Authority, Test Valley Borough to complete a screening exercise for the Habitat Regulations Assessment (HRA) to establish if a HRA Environmental Assessment (SEA) is required.

The Draft NP plan was sent to TVBC in January 2024 and the screening assessment requested.
